Unacceptable behaviour

- Calling out/talking/ off task lose a golden minute, no warning in KS2
- Repeated off task behaviour after losing golden minutes work in another classroom
- Repeated, consistent disruption after removal to another classroom - red card
- Racist comments (direct or indirect) half a day removal from the classroom, working elsewhere in school

Break Times and Lunch Times

- The rules and consequences are exactly the same.
- If you lose golden minutes outside, duty staff will ask your teacher to record your lost minutes



• If you are given a red outside, you will be sent inside to see:

Monday Miss McGough, Tuesday Mrs Hamilton, Wednesday Mrs Walklett Thursday Mrs Cox, Friday Mrs Hamilton

Leaving the classroom without permission, hurting others or swearing (words, gestures, words known to be a substitute for swear words) means you are given a red, you lose 15 minutes of your next break or lunch time and your parents are informed. A record will be kept of the number of times any child is on red each half term. The following action will be taken.

1	Mrs Hamilton discusses the incident with the pupil and their teacher. Teacher informs parent. Incident recorded in class behaviour log.
2	Parents and pupil asked to meet Mrs Hamilton within 48 hours. Incident recorded in class behaviour log
3	Pupil excluded from their classroom and learns in another classroom for $\frac{1}{2}$ day OR Pupil excluded from breaks/ lunches for 1 week (supervised by a
	staff member in school). Teacher notifies parent
4	Pupil excluded from their class/ breaks/ lunch times and works in isolation supervised by a Senior Leader for 1 full day. Mrs Hamilton notifies parent
More than 4	Pupil excluded from their class and works in another school for a set period
	OR
	Pupil suspended from school and works at home for a set period OR
	Pupil permanently excluded from school

Serious, deliberate harm to another child, adult or property or persistent disruption to the learning of others may result in suspension or exclusion without red cards
