Reading books and sound purses will be updated once a week.

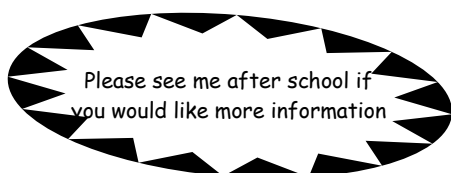


What can you do at home?

- It is so important to read with your child at home. We ask that you help your child with their reading book at least 4 times a week and sign their reading diary each time.
- Share the library books that we send home with your child. Read it to them and discuss the text; what happened, what they can see, make predictions about the next page, etc.
- Encourage your child to practice writing their name, forming letters (lowercase and capital), shopping lists, etc.
- Read books and visit the library together with your child to foster a love for reading.
- Support your child to count and recognise numbers in and around the environment.

Please ensure you have a log in for evidence me. Reasons why it is important.

- Staff will upload pictures of your child's learning.
- You will know what sound we are learning in phonics.
- You can share your child's progress with staff.
- It helps us get you know your child better

- Please label all items of clothes and shoes with your child's name; including hats and scarfs.
- No jewellery to be worn on PE days, including earrings. Full PE kit to be kept in school at all times (PE kits will be sent home half termly to be washed).
- **All children** in Reception are entitled to **Universal Free School Meals**, please encourage your child to try hot dinners. Please refer to the menu on the school website.
- Fruit, milk and water are provided throughout the day. Please bring £1 snack money into school each week.
